

# *The Wear it 3 ways hat!*

My inspiration for this hat was 2 things- I had a friend who needed a hat for running, but I also was inspired by hats from the 30's that were worn on the crown of the head. I also knit a child's version of this hat for a family member named Addy who is going through cancer treatment. Addy can be seen modeling the hat in the pattern. This hat can be worn year round for both fitness and fashion! This hat can be worn on the crown with the brim folded in half, as a beanie or a slouch hat! This hat is available in sizes newborn to adult.

## **Needles**

Size US6 (4mm)- 16" circulars

Size US6 (4mm) dpns

## **Finished Size**

newborn- 14- 15 inch head circumference

Toddler- 16-17 inch head circumference

Child 18-20 inch head circumference

Adult- 20-24inch head circumference

## **Gauge**

approx 6 sts per inch wide and 8 inches for height.

## **Yarn**

Approximately 150 yards of worsted weight yarn.

My favorite is Cascade Pacific.



## Abbreviations

CO- cast on  
k- knit  
p- purl  
k2tog- knit 2 together  
rnd- round  
ssk- slip slip knit  
sts- stitches



All Instructions between \*\* are repeated the entire round.

Moss stitch pattern for this hat-

Rounds 1 and 2: \*knit 1 purl 1\*;

Rounds 3 and 4: \*purl 1 knit 1\*;

With size 6 circulars- cast on 60 (80, 100, 120) sts and join in the round being careful not to twist the stitches.

K2 P2 for 2 (2.5, 3, 3) inches from the beginning

Begin working Moss stitch for 5 (5.5, 6, 7) inches from beginning or desired length.

## Begin Decrease

Place a marker every 20 sts

Round 1: \*ssk, work pattern 2 sts before marker, k2tog\*

Round 2: \*k1, work pattern, k1\*

repeat these 2 rounds until there are 4 sts between the markers.

Next round: \*ssk, k2tog\*;

Next round: \*k2tog\*;

## **Finishing**

Break yarn leaving about 5 inches. Weave the yarn through the remaining stitches pulling tight to close the hole. Weave in this and all ends and trim excess yarn.
